Keynote Speakers  	<p>Thursday: Raymond J. McNulty Senior vice President of the International Center for Leadership in Education. Prior to joining the International Center, he was a senior fellow at the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, where he worked with leading educators from around the country to reinvent our nation's high schools. The topic of Mr. McNulty’s keynote address is <i>“Success by Design, Not By Chance”</i>. “We all can talk about how wonderful our school is, and we all have stories about the student who came from a tough background and was a success. I know, because I was one of those students. It wasn’t by design that I was successful in the education system, it was by chance. We know enough today to create schools that are successful by design for all our children. The question is: Have we adjusted our system to account for many the changes schools have experienced? Are we preparing today’s students for the world in which they will live and work?” This session will explore the steps we need to take for our education system to have the ability to lead, adapt to change, and build success by design.</p> <p>Friday: Lieutenant General Benjamin Freakley, Commanding General, US Army Accessions Command will present information about the memorandum of understanding (MOU) that ACTE and the U.S. Army have signed which represents their commitment to continued dialogue and joint actions to help ensure that students are well prepared for success, whatever postsecondary path they choose—higher education, technical training, industry, military services or a combination of options.
